In those meetings we considered ourselves living on the edge by smoking cigars (I never got up the nerve)...Inhiations were creative events and were dreaded during the pledge years but turned out to be a lot of fun and resulted in real bonding. We had wonderful dances, and I never witnessed any behavior that was out of line. Ted Eaton was an advisor being either an original Rook or at least a devoted one whose wisdom help guide us. His memory should always be honored. The current owner of that house must have the best oak floors in the county because as pledges we waxed them every Saturday. Pledges war caps and had to do 3 "cuckoos" when an active pointed to them on the way to school or playground. So many of my class have gone west but I will always remember those wonderful days which were enriched by the friendships and ideals fo the brotherhood. I attempted to change the withdraw of our charter when I called the president of the schoolboard and was saddened by their stand.
