

Dear Fellow Bobcats:

THANK YOU for sending in your dues and contributions! Before we sent out the dues reminder, the Association's operating fund had a \$3,565 deficit. The operating fund covers community program grants, newsletters and the website. The GHHSAA Officers and Board of Directors all serve without compensation, so every dollar contributed goes directly towards our programs. If receipts exceed expenses, we add to the scholarship endowment. Thank you for your generosity and support.

What a great year 2011 has been! The Bobcat football team went 10-0 for a school record and the first undefeated season since 1955. The school system received an "excellent with distinction" rating and was highly ranked by the state. In the first such rating system, Grandview Heights schools ranked 65th out of 965 school districts statewide. The outstanding education tradition continues. Dawn Sayre was named the new high school principal. She brings experience, youth and enthusiasm to the school. The auditorium renovation is complete and is a showcase for Bobcat talent and community activities.

We added four new Distinguished Alumni to the total field of 24 alumni honored in the six years of this program. Many graduates were nominated and are still under consideration by the selection committee. It is a source of amazement and a testament to the school that our small number of graduates have so many and varied accomplishments. In reading the nomination statements, I have concluded that everyone who graduates from Grandview is distinguished by virtue of the education we received. Our scholarships help them on their way.

Some graduates have come forward and discussed making bequests to the GHHSAA for the scholarship endowment. Such donations can be for one-time scholarships or, if large enough, for scholarships to last indefinitely. They could be named for donors. We can certainly accommodate these donations with our tax-exempt status. Please contact me directly if you have such an interest in paying back as you pay forward.

From the Grandview Heights Historical Society Archives

The caption on this photograph indicates that it was taken May 18, 1943 during the GHHS LAL Sorority's "Hell Week". Pledges Wanda Rine, Pat Poulton and Joyce Jones are standing on the east side of Fairview Avenue south of the high school. They have mops, pails, an axe and a baby carriage. They are dressed like Cockney washwomen with frumpy hats and oversized shawls. State law banned high school sororities and fraternities in the early 1960's. The historical society would like to expand its LAL archive and document from any former members the actual purpose behind the costumes and the events that occurred during "Hell Week".

William P. Boardman '59 – Served as Chairman and CEO of First USA Inc., Senior Executive Vice President of Bank One, Chairman of Visa International and serves on

the board of Bank of America and a number of other corporate boards. Formerly a partner with Porter, Wright, Morris and Arthur and executive VP and General Counsel with BancOhio. Served two years as a field artillery officer. Holds a Bachelor degree and a Juris Doctor from Washington and Lee University.

Robert D. Rockey, Jr. '59 – Bob Rockey distinguished himself in the apparel industry with the phenomenal economic turnaround he orchestrated in the 1980's of Levi Strauss



Europe. As a result he was made President of Levi Strauss North America in 1991, a position he held until his retirement. He began his career in the clothing business working in the stock room of The Union Company's downtown Columbus store. He graduated from The Ohio State University, and served on active duty in the Navy off the coast of Vietnam, and subsequently in the Naval Reserve.



Tom Sutphen '43 – Tom is President and CEO of Sutphen Corporation, manufacturer of

custom fire trucks, pumpers, aerial ladders and aerial platforms (Invented Aerial Platform). He is a veteran of the U.S. Army Air Force, specialist in aircraft engine repair and maintenance. After WWII, he joined the family business, a small fire apparatus manufacturer dating back to 1890. As president and CEO, Tom steadily built the business, adding production facilities, creating new and innovative products, and increasing sales and distribution capabilities. Today, [Sutphen Corporation](http://www.sutphen.com) is one of the nation's largest manufacturers of custom fire trucks, pumpers, aerial ladders and aerial platforms.

William Walters '55 – Bill was a stage manager and actor, most notably for P.D.Q. Bach. He is known to the many thousands of loyal P.D.Q. Bach fans in New York and around the globe as the irascible and irritable stage

manager for Peter Schickele's attempts to foist off his own music as the work of an obscure son of a Bach. Despite his on-stage persona, however, Bill really was the backstage heart of the

Evening of Musical Madness. He was the technical coordinator, production manager, road manager, and

the REAL stage manager of the concerts. Starting in 1966, and for many years of bus tours, one-night events, airport departure lounges and appearances with every major (and most minor) symphony orchestras in the United States, he was the person who coordinated all touring logistics, handled the advance technical arrangements with each orchestra management and designed the special props. Our Fall sports teams have wrapped up immensely successful seasons. Our volleyball team finished 5th in the Cardinal Division with Maddie Gibbons being named 1st Team All-MSL and Maureen Flanagan 2nd Team. The tennis team placed 3rd in the MSL while earning a 4th seed in the central district. Leila Manirochana earned 1st Team All-MSL, Kiley Kinnard 2nd Team and Anna Oberla was named Honorable Mention All-MSL. Heading over to the links, we are proud of the golf team as they finished 2nd in the league and went undefeated in dual matches this year. And we had one of the most exciting and successful football seasons in GHHS history. Our football team went 10-0 in the regular season and clinched the MSL Championship. 
We are also proud of all the students that were a part of our Fall Play, "And Now for Something Completely Different". The play was filled with one-act scenes from our very talented students.



Grandview Heights/Marble Cliff Education Foundation 20 Years of Giving

This year, the Grandview Heights/Marble Cliff Education Foundation celebrates its 20th year of serving Grandview Heights and Marble Cliff by promoting educational opportunities in the community. "Helping to fund projects that enhance the educational experiences of students and community members is such a rewarding aspect of the Foundation's work," said Stephanie Brett, President of the Education Foundation Board of Trustees. "Over the years, the Foundation has been a part of so many exciting projects, and we always appreciate the chance to work with staff from Grandview Heights City Schools and other community groups to help make these projects possible."

The Education Foundation raises money to fund these projects by hosting an annual Gala. The 2012 Gala will be a particularly special event, as it is the 20th annual gala. "We like to think of the Education Foundation's Gala as the social event for the Grandview community," said Foundation trustee Susan Studebaker. "Although over the years we have used a variety of venues and themes for the event, it is always a fun and elegant evening with a gourmet dinner, live music, dancing and live and silent auctions. Members of the school system, leaders from the community, parents and neighbors come together to support this great cause. Everyone's invited to

attend as it's definitely a case of the more the merrier!"

Gala 2012 will be January 28, 2012 at the Ohio Union Ballroom and is being chaired by community members Janet Callison, Elaine Broderick and Sharla Thomas. "Grandview – both the school district and the neighborhood – has been great to us and we are honored to



have the opportunity to repay the community in this way," said Callison. "Everyone who lives in Grandview and Marble Cliff benefits from a successful Gala and we are planning a lighthearted, fun event that will provide people with not just a diversion during the bleakest part of winter, but also with reasons to celebrate the great work of the Education Foundation and generously support their mission. We are planning an amazing evening and hope to encourage friends and neighbors who don't regularly attend to join us this year. We think you'll be surprised!"

Of course, all of the work of the Education Foundation is only possible because of the generous support of the citizens and businesses of Grandview Heights and Marble Cliff. David Muhlenberg '33

Deceased in 2010, Mr. Muhlenberg was a man of few words when it comes to sharing stories about his military experiences, but said he's proud of his service during World War II, when he trained bombardiers in North Africa. Muhlenberg said he couldn't quite pin down the city he considered his hometown — but said Columbus, Ohio, was central to most of this activities while he was growing up. "I was an Army brat," he said. "I lived in a lot of different places." Muhlenberg, who said he also served in the U.S. Navy, "started in '40 with the Army Air Corps," he said.

He was stationed in Casablanca during his time as a bombardier instructor. "I thought it was a great spot," he said. "I enjoyed it." Preparing men to become pilots meant he had to qualify himself

in a number of different aircraft, including trainers, bombers and cargo planes. "It was very rewarding to watch the guys and know that I had something to do with their getting

trained and qualified," he said. "I thought that my students were very good."

The North African campaign lasted from June 10, 1940, through May 16, 1943. The U.S. forces joined Allied forces in the struggle in early May 1942. Muhlenberg's career extended beyond World War II, and by the end of his years of service, Muhlenberg had attained the rank of lieutenant colonel. Muhlenberg lived at Atria Hacienda, a senior

living community in Palm Desert, where a number of World War II Veterans reside.
